4 President's Report

Men's Sheds of WA President, Trevor Taylor provided a report of the year's activities in conjunction with James Wild, CEO of Men's Sheds of WA.

Trevor acknowledged that the year has been full of hardship with Covid-19 creating social isolation for members and in some instance's financial hardship for the Sheds with loss of fundraising and membership activities.

For Men's Sheds of WA, the year was one of change with the retirement of the old administrative team Gary Bryant and Margaret Collingwood and the hiring of a new team, James Wild, CEO, Jaxon Ashley, Development Officer and Rebecca Herbener, Executive Assistant.

During the height of the Covid-19 crisis in WA, CEO James Wild attended weekly meetings with other community groups, peak bodies and state government agencies to share information.

Changes to the Board since the last meeting included:

- Kevin Skipworth, (appointed) stepped down in November 2019
- Tom Perrigo (appointed) stepped down in October 2019
- Michael Woodhouse (appointed) resigned in September 2020
- Russell Candy, having served his full two terms, will be stepping down today
- Harry White, finishes his first term today and has renominated for another threeyear term.

Trevor thanked all current and past Board Members for their contribution to Men's Sheds of WA and for their continued support to the Men's Sheds movement in WA.

During the year the Board undertook a skills audit. As a result a recruitment process was undertaken to appoint suitable members to the Board. These members will begin their terms in November 2020. These members are:

It was also noted that among daily business throughout the year the Board approved:

- A new budget and financial reporting method
- Strategic plan 2020-24
- Shedders pledge which will form the basis of a Code of Conduct which Sheds will be welcome to adopt in their Shed
- Commissioned a new website and associated branding
- Participated in seven public consultation processes
- Developed eight new programs to be delivered into Sheds including Be-Connected, Shed Arts &Crafts, ShedSong and Aboriginal Employment Program
- Covid-19 response took up significant time and resources, especially between March and July.

8 Notice of Special Resolutions

8.1 Amendment to 2.1 of the Rules of Association (Principle Purpose)

During the review of the Strategic plan the mission statement was amended to better reflect the objectives of the Men's Sheds of WA organisation. It is therefore proposed that the new mission statement (...to support and promote the wellbeing and health of men through building a sustainable community of Men's Sheds) also be adopted as the organisation's Object/ Principal Purpose in the Rules of Association.

<u>Recommendation</u> Change the principle purpose of the rules of association from: 'The principal purpose of the Men's Sheds of WA is to promote the prevention and control of diseases in men.'

To: 'The principal purpose of the Men's Sheds of WA is to support and promote the wellbeing and health of men through building a sustainable community of Men's Sheds.'

9 Questions to the Board

Ron Croager of Harrisdale Men's Shed queried the status of the working party formed at the AGM 2019 to develop strategies and implement mechanisms to resolve the commonwealth funding situation and the impasse with the national body the Australian Men's Sheds Association (AMSA)

The working party was unanimously disbanded when the federal Department of Health advised they would undertake a review.

A question from the floor queried the Community Sheds DGR (deductible gift recipient) status. His Shed applied and was informed that the Shed's Constitution would require changing to ensure that should the Shed fail then any DGR funds could be passed on to a similar Shed with DGR certification

It was noted that its good practice for a Constitution to have a wind-up clause and is not necessarily specific to DGR.

10 Meeting Close

Trevor Taylor thanked everyone for their attendance and participation he noted that despite the Covid crisis this had been one of the most successful of the last six years for the board and closed the meeting at 10.45 am.

The AGM occurred during Get Online Week. Get Online Week is an annual campaign which encourages everyone to improve their digital literacy skills. The AGM was followed by morning tea and a presentation by James Wild, CEO and Jaxon Ashley, Development Officer on the Men's Sheds of WA Be Connected program which aims to raise digital literacy in older Australians by encouraging Sheds to ensure there is at least one digital mentor in their Shed who can support other members to get comfortable online.
