COVID-19 safe	Ensure WA State Government COVID-19 current safety Guidelines and plans are adhered to. Please refer to https://www.wa.gov.au/government/covid-19-coronavirus for the latest advice and guidelines.
Welcome to Country Acknowledgement of Country	Appropriately Acknowledge Country or Welcome to Country. Please refer to Reconciliation Australia.
Access and inclusion	 Addressing access needs, including parking and facilities to help those with physical needs (people with disability, prams, walking aids etc.), with relevant information publicised in advance Publicity materials to be clear and easily legible Information to be available in languages other than English Auslan interpreter service and subtitles included for digital content Event to be affordable.
Environmental sustainability	 Avoid or limit single-use plastics Effective management of waste including recyclable and organic materials Information and promotion of public transport and bike parking options Minimisation of printed promotional material Use of sustainable merchandise (no single-use plastics like balloons) Use of energy efficient venue and facilities.
Healthy food and drink options	 Provision of free drinking water or refill options Availability of healthy food and minimisation of unhealthy food and drink options Responsible service and promotion of alcohol practices.
Sun smart	 Provision of adequate sunshade Provision of free sunscreen More information and suggestions available in the <u>Sun Smart</u> event guide.
Smoke free	Smoke free events, or designated smoking areas.
